Birding the Danube Delta and Southern Carpathians

Dalmatian and White Pelican



DANUBE DELTA AND BLACK SEA COAST

The Danube Delta comprises of an intricate network of waterways and lakes divided between the three main estuary channels of the Danube. The area of floating reed islands, forests, pastures and sand dunes covers 3,000 square miles and is home to a vast array of wildlife. The Danube Delta falls within east European steppe ecosystem, with Mediterranean influences. Macin Mts. are very old, low granite hills (500m) some 80 km west of the Danube Delta. A great passage and raptor site. Large lagoons and grazed salty steppes south in the proper Delta are extremely bird rich (like Razim-Sinoe lagoon with over 1.015 km²).

SOUTHERN CARPATHIAN MOUNTAINS

A notoriously known enigmatic region of the high Carpathians with splendid scenery and vast tracts of forests. Mountain birds are still often easy to find due to no disturbace. We might make a small detour to see the Dracula's Castle Bran.

Romania should be high on the list of destinations for every birdwatcher. The Danube Delta is for those who enjoy spectacular birdwatching: huge flocks of pelicans, waders, cormorants, reedbeds full of warblers, marshes full of ducks, herons and ibises. On the Black Sea coast of Dobrogea sought after raptors fly overhead and in the forests, hills and plains nearby you find Levant Sparrowhawk, Booted Eagle, Pied Wheatear, Rock Thrush and Sombre Tit. The extensive wetlands along the sea provide habitat for rare resident species and thousands of migrating birds as well, including pelicans, Ruddy Shelduck and Paddyfield Warbler. The Carpathian mountains provide a contrast and a good opportunity to discover exciting mountain species including Ural and Tengmalm's Owl, Wallcreeper, Alpine Swift, Ring Ouzel, and Nutcracker. There is also a chance to see Chamois and Brown Bear.
